UAE Ministry of Interior's Child Protection Center & ICDL distribute pocket guide on cyber safety to students

contains 101 tips on internet etiquette and the responsible use of various social media websites and smart technologies.

Major General Nasser Lakhraibani Al Nuaimi, Secretary General of the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister, Interior Minister and Chairman of the Higher Committee for Child Protection, said: "The welfare of children has always been of paramount importance to the Ministry of Interior, which strives to support local and international efforts to protect children from various forms of abuse."

Lieutenant Colonel Faisal Mohammed Al Shammari, Director, Child Protection Center, Ministry of Interior, and Chairman of the Organizing Committee in charge of the Ministry of Interior's participation at the GITEX, said: "The pocket guide is intended to reach parents as well through their children to provide them with important information to educate their young ones on safe practices of using the internet and social networking websites. them on social networking websites in order to monitor their activities and acquaintances and guide them."

This initiative offers a complete reference for children and youths to positively benefit from the internet and social networks and stay away from possible abuses, something that has become alarmingly popular among various social circles, especially youths.
