The mother and son both appeared for the test, but while the boy cleared it in just 20 days, his mother got the same in not less than three months.

Khalid's father hopes that his son's talent will be nurtured further and the next step he is looking for is the nomination of Khalid for Hamdan Award for the distinguished academic performance.

Ever since he joined the school, Khalid has always topped the class, his mother said.
